Jackpot Window Signs 2012-2
JWS2012-2 Questions/Answers

- 1. Question: Has this job been done before? If so, who did it and what was the price?**

Answer: The South Carolina Education Lottery has had various jackpot signs since joining the Powerball® Group in October 2002. When Mega Millions® became available for cross-selling in January 2009, the jackpot sign expanded to include the jackpots of both multi-state jackpot games.

The last time these signs were ordered was in August 2010. King International won the bid to produce 500 signs, 1,000 j-channels, and 3,000 spiral number pads at the cost of \$7,725. The price also included the price of an instruction sheet and a squeegee. The 2010 signs were made of a different substrate (4 mil clear vinyl with low tack adhesive) and a different printing process (UV screen printing) from what is being requested in the current IFB. Additionally, the current sign solicitation is only for the sign; the j-channels, numbers, instruction sheet and squeegee are not included in the current solicitation.

- 2. Question: Do you have a pdf sample of what the sign will look like?**

Answer: Please see the attached pictures. These photographs are of jackpot signs in use currently. No jackpot signs have been produced using the new substrate, 8mil Dead Opaque White Vinyl with LoTack Adhesive on front side, and new printing process, High density Litho printing with UV resistant Litho pigments.
