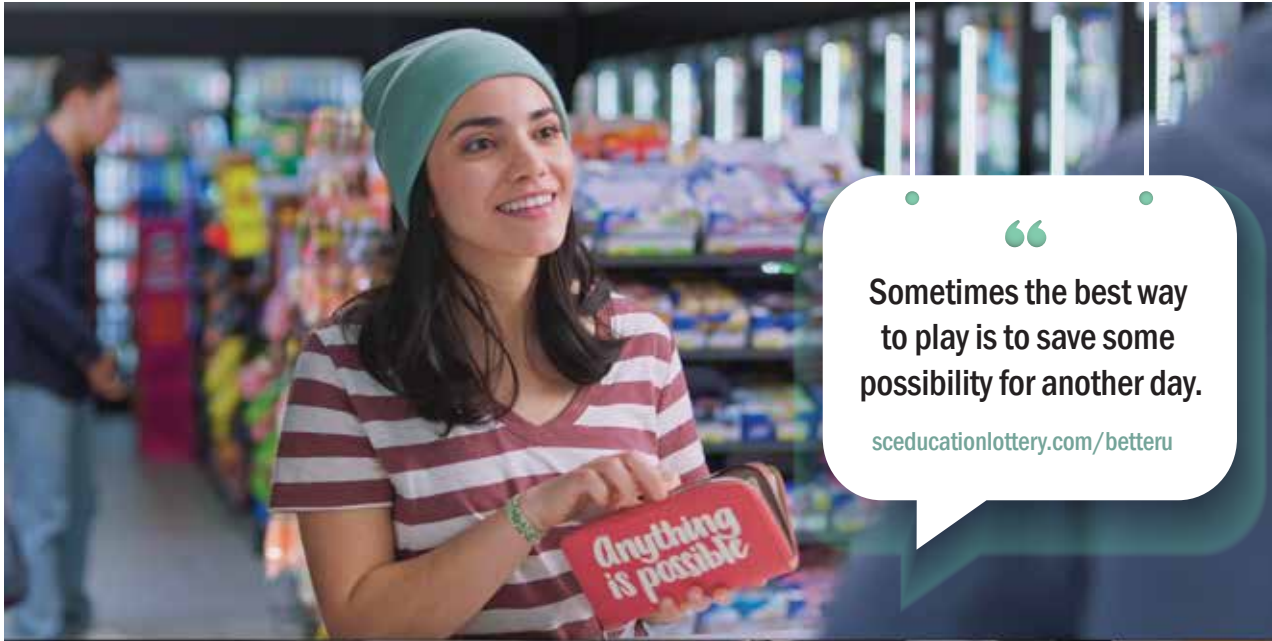

Let's talk about knowing your limits

Anytime is a good time to remind your lottery players to know their limits. It's an easier conversation to have than you might think.

Sure, you might win on this ticket, but you might not. And when you don't win, buying another ticket isn't going to change that.

Sometimes the best way to play is to save some possibility for another day.

March is Play Responsibly month. We never want our games to be anything other than fun. And we know you feel the same way. So that's why we are asking you to take a moment to familiarize yourself with these warning signs or problem gambling.

WARNING SIGNS OF PROBLEM GAMBLING

- Thinking about gambling all the time.
- Feeling the need to bet more money and more often.
- Going back to try to win your money back.

- Feeling restless or irritable when trying to stop or cut down.
- Feeling like you can't control yourself.
- Gambling despite negative consequences.
- In extreme cases, problem gambling can cause bankruptcy, legal problems, losing your job or your family, and thinking about suicide.

If any of these warning signs remind you of a player, please encourage them to set a limit or hand them a BetterU Brochure available in your play station.

Everything is so expensive. Lots of players are setting a budget for how much they spend on tickets. It helps them save some cash for more important things.

Gambling addiction is a disruptive and destructive problem. The BetterU Brochure is an excellent resource to share. Inside players will find resources and the phone number for the gambling helpline manned by the SC Department of Behavioral Health and Development Disabilities.

On a lucky streak, three players find their 'pot of gold' at Columbia convenience store

A Midlands convenience store has achieved lucky store status. In a span of four months, the **J K Mart** on Two Notch Rd. in **Columbia** celebrated a trio of big wins.

The lucky streak started with a \$100,000 win followed by two more customers winning \$50,000.

And that's not even the best part. All three of their big winners were store regulars.

"It's a really good feeling," said KP Patel, who runs the store alongside his brother Jay. "We've known the winners for a long time and are very happy for them."

KP was standing right next to the \$100,000 winner when he won. KP sold him a \$10 *Double Up!* scratch-off, and says the customer scanned the ticket with his phone. He showed KP the "Claim at Lottery" message, and KP invited him behind the counter where they scratched the ticket together.

Five weeks after that, the store sold a \$2 *Jumbo Bucks* ticket worth \$50,000. And eight weeks later, a customer won \$50,000 playing Powerball®.

The stretch of wins was both a surprise and a relief according to the brothers. They have been running the store since 2015, and these are their biggest wins to date.

And their customers are loving it. The store has always been a popular spot to play, and now they are selling even more tickets.

"Customers come by and say, 'Why didn't you sell it to me?'" said KP.

REMINDERS

BY STATE LAW, ODDS INFORMATION MUST BE DISPLAYED IN ALL RETAIL OUTLETS ADJACENT TO SCEL POINT OF SALE. This information is included in the piece called "Odds of Our Games."

Display the Top Prizes Remaining Report: Every morning when you sign in the terminal will generate a "Top Prizes Remaining" report. Post this updated report in the clear sleeve or change mat on your counter. The clear sleeve must be on your dispenser or near the point of purchase.

Prizes remaining, end-of-game and odds information for scratch-off games is available by scanning a QR Code posted at the play station. Make sure you display this QR Code in your play station.

The call is toll-free, 1-877-452-5155, and confidential. Trained counselors are available to help with individualized assessment and treatment plans for callers.

Make it your priority, and the policy of your store, to promote responsible play. If this means denying someone a ticket when they've bought too many, then that's o.k.

MUST BE 18 TO PURCHASE

Lottery retailers may NOT sell a lottery ticket to anyone under the age of 18. If you are in doubt about a customer's age, check their ID to be sure they are 18 or older. The lottery terminal provides the "legal sell age" required to purchase a ticket and updates daily to assist you when checking ID. Also, make sure the "Must be 18" disclaimer is visible to your customers too.
